Three principles

Legitimacy

Governance arrangements need to be seen as legitimate in the view of those that are implicated.

Effectuation

The effective implementation of the various components of governance requires clear procedures/processes and systems.

Coordination

All of this requires fostering interactions across and between all actors to ensure consistency/completeness.

At the surface

The most tell-tale signs of governance are within the dimensions of **legislation** and **voluntary codes and standards**. 'What is on paper' and how this is implemented and coordinated by rule-making actors and standard setters.

What's below?

The dimensions of **collaborative arrangements** refer to joint initiatives and actions of various actors. While **capabilities** refer to their individual ability to affect governance.

Our foundation

At the foundation of the framework are three principles capturing the idea that aquaculture governance has to be credible, effective and well-aligned.
